

Comic Book Artist Character & Costume Sheet Costumes are the responsibility of each cast member and must be approved by the Director by Feb. 27.

Character	Character Description	Costume Description
NARRATOR	Comic-book type character with a dramatic flair	Colorful outfit or suit – like the Joker from Batman Prop: handkerchief
STANLEY LEONARDO SAPPOVITZ	Slightly nerdy young man	Janitor outfit – i.e. button up shirt and pants, t-shirt that says "Eraser Man" under button up shirt Prop: Broom, Portrait of Shock Clock, shield
MR. WUNDERMAN	Typical Mel Brooks-type businessman	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie Prop: fancy box filled with pens and giant eraser
ARTISTS	Wunderman's staff (at least three, up to six)	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses Prop: sketchpads
VIOLA	Wunderman's competent but slightly air-headed secretary, falls in love with Stanley	Two outfits – one is office attire – with a skirt and wide belt; needs a different "party" outfit for Act II but same wide belt Prop: folder, newspaper
DOCTOR SHOCK CLOCK	Villain, can stop time with the snap of his fingers	BLUE Villain costume – i.e. leggings and matching shirt, cape and mask Clocks and watches galore!
MINUTOS	Dr. Shock Clock's henchmen (at least three)	BLUE costume that matches Shock Clock, blue shirt and leggings Clocks and watches galore! Prop: bag for bank robbery
STAR GUY	Full-of-himself superhero, charisma ray is his main superpower	Cape, shirt and/or leggings covered in stars, adds brightly colored basketball shorts in Act II Prop: Charisma ray (could be a hair dryer decorated to match Star Guy's costume); handheld mirror
TRIPLE TIME	Super-fast superhero, has constant tension with Star Guy	Red superhero costume – i.e. red shirt and leggings, optional mask and cape
BLOSSOM	Environmental superhero, magical flowers put enemies to sleep	Shirt and leggings covered in flowers; optional mask and cape Prop: Flowers
WOMBAT WOMAN	Slightly grouchy but good-hearted superhero, super-burrower	Brown hoodie with front pocket, cape, hat, glittery mask, optional fur-covered items
KIDS	16 parts, kids will be reading comic books	Everyday atire Prop: Comic Books

GIRLS	Interact with Star Guy as fans; Also fans of rock band Rotten Penny	Everyday attire
BANK TELLER	Present during Shock Clock's robbery at the bank	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses Prop: stacks of fake money
BANK CUSTOMER	Present during Shock Clock's robbery at the bank	Office or casual attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses
GOLD WAREHOUSE MANAGER	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses Prop: Crate full of gold bars
GOLD WAREHOUSE EMPLOYEES	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses
JEWELRY SALESCLERK	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses Prop: Necklace, jewels
JEWELRY CUSTOMER	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree	Office or casual attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses
GLADYS	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree – friend of jewelry customer	Office or casual attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses
WOMAN WITH PURSE	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree	Office attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses Prop: purse
ROCK GROUP	Play music to entertain crowd members	Accessories: blow up instruments (i.e. guitar, saxophone), drum sticks, wigs or vests, jackets that can be used for quick changes
EMCEE	Introduces rock groups	Accessories: large sunglasses, large necklace, funky jacket that can be used for quick changes
ROTTEN PENNY	Rock star	Accessories: blow up instruments (i.e. guitar, saxophone), drum sticks, wigs, vests, jackets that can be used for quick changes Prop: fancy box filled with coins
CROWD MEMBERS	People enjoying the rock groups perform	Office or casual attire – i.e. button up shirts, suit jackets, tie or bowtie, suspenders, skirts or dresses
POLICEMEN	Present during Shock Clock's crime spree	Police accessories – i.e. police hat, badge, handcuffs, baton Prop: pen and notepad
NEWSBOY	Selling papers about Shock Clock's crime spree	Accessories: newsboy cap, bag, newspapers

Please note: Many of these costume pieces can be purchased from Goodwill/ found in your closet Please wear neutral base (tan/white tank top & shorts) under costume for quick changes

Hair should be pushed back out of your face; Make up should be used to highlight facial features as stage lights will wash them out. It is recommended that actors wear mascara, slightly darkened brows, pink or red lipstick or gloss, and a pink blush on cheeks.

Actors are encouraged to bring in costumes to any rehearsal for approval but all costumes are due Feb. 27. Please keep costumes at home. Costumes should be worn for all rehearsals beginning March 5.
