### **Responsibility of Lead Teacher**

This individual is the point of contact who has filled out the registration from and signed the waiver for the school field trip for the designated program. We ask the lead teacher to present the chaperone policy to adult chaperones attending the program. This is just one step in aiding in your student's learning environment and we thank you in advance for passing this along and reminding adult chaperones of their role during the program.

Even though adult chaperones are not "actively" participating in the program, it will be helpful for them to either show good listening skills and other behavior as this is still a time for students to learn! We welcome questions by chaperones, as sometimes information may be new to them too! If something makes people feel uncomfortable, that's okay! But we do ask to keep one's opinions to oneself as to assist in a student's engagement and overall experience. If playing in the mud is not your preference that is fine, but sometimes in programs we will do things not normally done at home or school, but can be very valuable to your student's learning.

### **Chaperone Policy**

## Adult Chaperones:

- For grades PreK through 3rd grade, one responsible adult chaperone for every five students in attendance.
- For grades four through middle school, one responsible adult chaperone must accompany every ten students in attendance.
- Chaperones understand their importance of appropriate behavior as well; being role models for the group is very important and expected, including but not limited to phone usage and limiting other disruptions made during the program
- Chaperones understand your expectations for the students. We appreciate chaperones who assist our naturalists in keeping excited students appropriately disciplined/redirected.
- All chaperones are free of charge.
