## General Safety Rules & Policies

- Gym shoes are required every day for safe play.
- Only Geneva Park District staff, registered participants, parents/guardians, invited guests, and approved emergency contacts are allowed in camp areas.
- Once a child is picked up, they may not return to camp that day.
- No personal electronics or toys from home. Staff are not responsible for lost or damaged items.
- Clothing must be appropriate—no images of violence or inappropriate themes.
- Outdoor activities are a big part of camp—dress accordingly!
- Campers and staff will practice proper hand hygiene.
- Additional staff are present to maintain a maximum ratio of 1:10 and to support with cleaning and camper needs.

# Weather Policy

Camp runs rain or shine! In the case of severe weather, call Sunset Community Center for updates.

In cases of extreme heat, staff will:

- Increase water breaks
- Limit physical activity

• Relocate campers to air-conditioned spaces when needed

Please apply sunscreen and bug spray before drop-off each day, as campers will be outside and exposed to sun and bugs.

# Water Days (Traditional Camps Only)

Not all camps participate—please refer to your camp's newsletter or calendar for details.

- On water days, send your child in their swimsuit (under clothing) with a towel.
- Some camps will visit Sunset Pool. Swim tests will be offered by lifeguards on your child's first swim day.
  - Note: Taking the swim test is optional. If they opt out, pool access will be limited but still enjoyable.
- Colored wristbands will be used to help staff identify swimming ability.
- Additional water play (like splash pads or park sprinklers) may be scheduled. If listed in your newsletter, dress your child accordingly.

### **Pool Safety Guidelines:**

- No hanging on counselors in the pool.
- Swim tests are administered by Geneva Park District lifeguards.
- Lifequards have final say on swim ability and safety.
- Campers not following pool rules may lose aquatic privileges.
